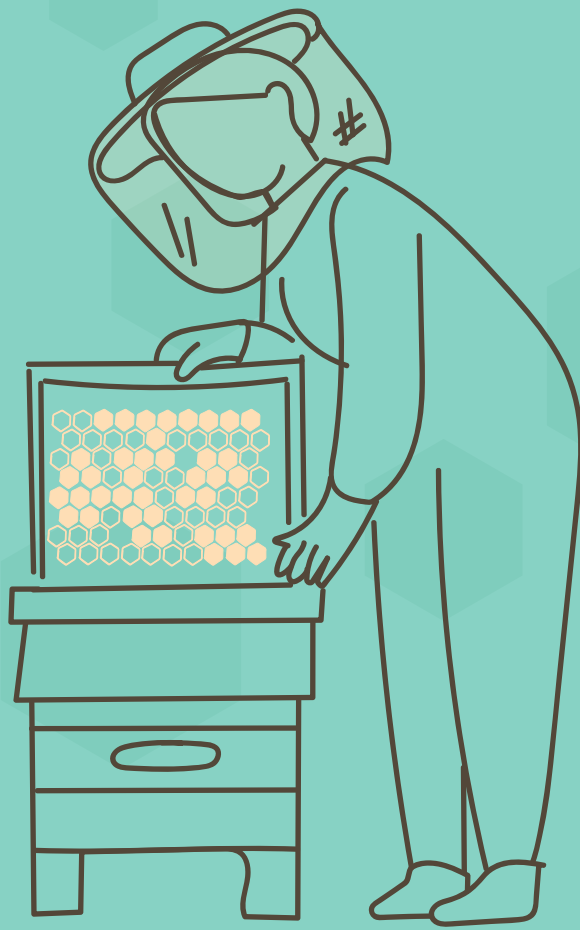


Perform selection to have queens that are more resistant to disease and adapted to local climatic conditions

Using good queens is very important for correct management in beekeeping. Queens are healthy if they are productive, resistant to diseases and adapted to local conditions. Genetic selection is central to obtaining that. Better if it is done on the same honeybee population of the apiary. Otherwise, it is recommended to buy queens from breeders who raise queens in the same area.



step 1

Honey bee selection is a long-term breeding process that involves continuously selecting and breeding bees with the best qualities to produce offspring with even better characteristics.

To choose the best colonies, evaluate their qualities in terms of hygienic behaviour, gentleness, and prolific egg laying, etc.



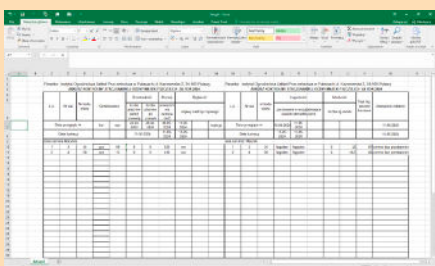
step 2

For selection, choose drones of known origin and collect their semen for instrumental insemination.



step 3

In colonies with desirable qualities, prepare queens that you will instrumentally inseminate.



step 4

Keep a detailed and systematic record.
